hen two Chicago coffee salesmen, David Radway and Lawrence Weingarten, ventured out on their own in 1934, they ended up in Lansing. "Both my father and Mr. Weingarten had saved \$1,000 from working," Ronald Radway, the second generation of the Rad-

way family to run Paramount Coffee Co., told the State Journal in a Sept. 26, 1977 article. "They started out with a storefront operation on Turner Street and one small truck." Now an employee-owned company, Paramount runs an 80,000-square-foot roasting plant and is looking to expand. See Page 4.
